### **FWBBC Women's Resident Director Resigns**

NASHVILLE, TN—Mrs. Darla Trimble, women's resident director at Free Will Baptist Bible College for the past year, resigned effective May 15, according to Dr. Jon Forlines, vice president for student services and dean of students. Mrs. Trimble plans to relocate to Fort Campbell, Kentucky, this summer where she will pursue ministry opportunities on the Army base while her husband, Chaplain Kevin Trimble, is deployed in Afghanistan.

Mrs. Susan Forlines, FWBBC's dean of women, said, "We have been so delighted to work with Mrs. Trimble this year. She reached out to the girls in the dormitory with energy and understanding, and gave them a sense of family and security. Her years as a pastor's wife provided the practical touch necessary to advise maturing young women, many of whom were away from home for the first time. We will miss her, and we wish her God's best as she transitions to military life."

In addition to her regular duties as resident director, Mrs. Trimble continued her physical fitness regimen running five or six miles daily and preparing to run a half-marathon this spring. Her daughter Rachel is a sophomore Psychology major at FWBBC. Her son Nathan studies at Vanderbilt University.

"Getting to know the girls in the dormitory has been so fulfilling," Mrs. Trimble said. "Each one has a unique personality, and God only knows what may be ahead for them. One thing that caught me by surprise is how they all respond so eagerly and positively to late night activities. Their schedules are full; there's never a dull moment!"

Mrs. Trimble expects to minister among the Fort Campbell military families this fall through two elementary schools on base. As a chaplain's wife, she also plans to be on call to assist the wives and children of service personnel as needs arise. Chaplain Trimble is scheduled to return to the USA in late winter or early spring 2011.
