FWBBC Plans Go10 'Walk for the World' Celebration

NASHVILLE, TN—The 2,500-mile Go10 Walk for the World event will pause at Free Will Baptist Bible College on Saturday afternoon, June 19 for and a cookout with music on the front lawn, followed by a special drama and musical presentation honoring pioneer missionary Laura Belle Barnard, according to President Matt Pinson.
