FWBBC Kicks Off Senior Days Events

NASHVILLE, TN—The first is a series of four 2008-2009 “Senior Days” events at Free Will Baptist Bible College brought 10 high school seniors from four states to campus October 16-18 for get-acquainted sessions, according to Jeff Caudill, director of enrollment services. Senior Days also included an opportunity to discover Nashville as students toured the world-famous Parthenon and went ice skating.

Lynsey Riggs, enrollment management secretary, said, “Senior Days is a great way for prospective students to see what FWBBC campus life is all about. It’s a time when they get to know the college and for us to know them. I can hardly wait to meet the next group of seniors. Four of the 10 seniors who attended applied to FWBBC, and we expect others from the group to send in their applications soon.”
