FAQS

What should dorm students do when they arrive?

Follow the FWBBC signs to the Student Center on Richland Avenue. FWBBC students and personnel will greet you and direct you to your dorm. You will receive a schedule to make your adjustment to FWBBC easier. You will be given a room assignment and assistance moving into your room. At the Student Center, your ID will be made and your car will be registered.

The women's dormitory is Polston Hall. Mrs. Anna McAfee serves as Resident Director.

The men's dormitory is Goen Hall. Mr. Mike Edwards serves as Resident Director.

Which bed/bunk should I choose?

Upperclassmen are traditionally given first choice on bed selection. Generally, this means new women students get the hall side (B) and new men students get the top bunk (B).

What basic necessities will I need for my dorm room?

- Bed linens and towels
Women's dorm has standard twin mattress (36" x 75").
Men's dorm has extra-long twin mattress (36" x 80").
- Basic room supplies: desk lamp, waste basket, alarm clock, telephone
- Laundry/cleaning supplies
- School supplies
- Clothing and personal items - bring clothes seasonally as closet space is limited (35" wide).

You may also want to bring:

- Radio, CD player (Rock, rap and similar music are prohibited at FWBBC.)
- Computer (We have wireless in select locations on campus, and a computer lab available to all students.)
- Coffee pot, iron, toaster (not toaster oven)
- Carpet
(Women: up to 6' x 8' / Men: 12' x 12')

You may wish to wait until you arrive on campus to coordinate some of these purchases with your roommate.

Are there any items I should not bring to my dorm room?

- Hot Plates
- Halogen Lamps
- Barbells
- Microwaves
- Additional room furniture
- Large musical instruments (drums, etc.)

*Refrigerators are *not* allowed in the women's dorm.

If a young woman has a valid medical condition that requires refrigeration of medication, special permission to bring a small unit will be granted through the Dean of Women. A doctor's statement is requested for this exception. No more than one unit will be permitted in any room in either dorm.

What standards of conduct are upheld?

FWBBC stands for clean and holy living. We recognize that every detail of right living cannot be regulated by rules. Nevertheless, the following standards cover several of the main issues about which questions might arise. Please be sure to check the *Student Handbook*.

- Attending the movie theater is prohibited.
- No alcoholic beverages, tobacco, illegal drugs, or narcotics in any form.
- All students are expected to be modest in dress and in behavior.
- The college adheres to a policy of absolute honesty. Therefore, cheating or dishonesty in any form will not be tolerated.
- Sexual immorality or behavior that raises questions about sexual immorality will not be tolerated.

What are the general standards of dress?

FWBBC has a conservative view of dress and behavior. This practice is intended to promote excellence, appropriateness, morality, and high academic standard. With this in mind, as stated in the *Student Handbook*, the dress policy follows these guidelines:

Casual Dress: Loose fitting slacks/jeans, tennis shoes.

Athletic Wear: Knee-length, loose-fitting athletic apparel can be worn while actively participating in sporting activities, both indoor and outdoor.

Classroom Dress:

Women – Dress shoes or dress sandals (no flip-flops), dresses or skirts with blouses or sweaters.

Men – Dress shoes, dress slacks (no jeans), dress shirt, dress socks, and tie.

Church Dress:

Women – Dress shoes, suits, dresses, skirts (no denim) with blouses or sweaters, and hose.

Men – Dress shoes, dress pants, sport coat or suit, dress shirt, tie, and dress socks.

No person in whatever relation with Free Will Baptist Bible College shall be subject to discrimination because of race, color, national origin, age, gender or disability.

Sunday and Wednesday Evening and Sunday Lunch:

Women – Same as Sunday mornings, but without hose.

Men – Coat and tie not required.

A nice sport shirt or polo shirt with collar may be worn with dress pants or dress khakis.

Can I have a vehicle on campus?

Dormitory students are permitted to have vehicles on campus. Students in the dorm may not bring motorcycles. You will be assigned a parking zone during registration and a fee will be added to your bill. Cars parked on the street after regular class sessions begin will be ticketed and fined.

Remember to bring current registration documents and verification of insurance to registration session.

Is there a designated parking area for commuter students?

Parking is available for commuter students at the West End Church of Christ parking lot (across from the gym). Cars parked on the street will be ticketed and fined.
