Ken Riggs Named Interim Psychology Professor at FWBBC

NASHVILLE, TN—Dr. Ken Riggs, former FWBBC faculty member, has been named to an interim post as program coordinator for Psychology at Free Will Baptist Bible College, according to Provost Greg Kettelman. The 12- to 18-month appointment begins in January 2012, as Dr. Riggs assumes responsibility for duties previously handled by Jackie Rasar who resigned as program coordinator this summer to accept a position with a women’s mental health center.

“We are delighted to welcome Dr. Riggs back to the college faculty,” Dr. Kettelman said. “He taught here 23 years (1971-1993) and chaired the Teacher Education Department. He brings a wide range of educational experience from both private and public education. He will provide leadership to the Psychology program and will also assist in the area of Teacher Education in this critical interim period.”

Dr. Riggs, a 1964 FWBBC graduate, earned masters degrees at Old Dominion University and Middle Tennessee University, and a Ph.D. at George Peabody College. He served as principal of the Free Will Baptist denomination’s first Christian school in Virginia and, most recently, principal at Pleasant View Christian School, a Free Will Baptist school in middle Tennessee. He is the author of three books: *The Runaway*, *By the Way*, and his recent autobiography, *They Call Me Doc*.

Ken and Carolyn Riggs have three adult sons—Jeff, Kevin, and Jonathan.
